Children in Need Day

Greens Lane

Please could we remind everyone of the importance of considerate and safe parking around our school, particularly on Greens Lane. Recently, we have received concerns from local residents about unsafe and inconsiderate parking during drop-off and pick-up times.

Please remember:

- Do not park on double yellow lines or across driveways.
- Avoid stopping in the middle of the road, even for a short time.
- Turn carefully and safely without using residents' driveways.
- Park a little further away and walk if space is limited

The safety of our pupils and families, as well as our relationship with our neighbours, depends on everyone following these simple expectations. We all share the responsibility to ensure that our school community is one that shows respect and care for others.

Breakfast and After School Club

If you wish to book your child into the club, please ensure you have completed and returned the Wraparound Care Contract and Contact Form.

As the provision will be run by school staff, the times and fees will be as follows:

Breakfast Club- 8am-8.50am £3.50 per child per session

After School Club- 3.30pm-5.30pm £6.50 per child per session



Payment must be made before your child attends the club and children can be booked into either club up to midnight the night before. We hope that families will support the provision so that we can keep make it a long term childcare provision to support all of our families, at the moment we are at risk of losing the after school provision due to the low uptake of places.

Attendance Matters: Together, Every Day Counts

Good attendance is one of the most important ways we can help children succeed – both in their learning and in their friendships.

Did You Know? Children who attend school regularly are more likely to achieve better grades and build stronger friendships?

Please can we remind parents that school is not able to authorise any holidays during term time. Therefore, it is important to consult these dates before making any booking. Penalty Notice Fines are issued on a per parent per child basis for term time leave of 5 (10 sessions) or more consecutive days.

As school is in session during these times, if your child does not attend school due to an unauthorised absence, school will not provide work for this period of time as children are expected to attend school to undertake their learning.

Penalty Notice Fines are also considered, if a child has 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in 10 school weeks.

We are committed to improving achievement through attendance, and any pupil whose attendance falls below 97% becomes a cause for concern. Attendance below 90% is classed by the Government as persistent absence. If a child's attendance falls below 90% we refer all cases to the Education Welfare Office at East Riding Council, who is likely to contact parents directly to give support and discuss the matter.

If anyone would like to make us an outdoor kitchen for the school field, this is also on our ever-growing wish list to enhance break times for the children!



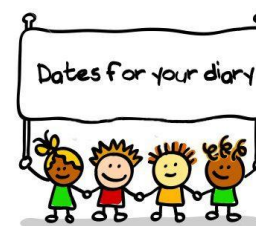
Christmas Decoration Competition
