"English and Science are my favourite subjects," Ms Blake clarified.

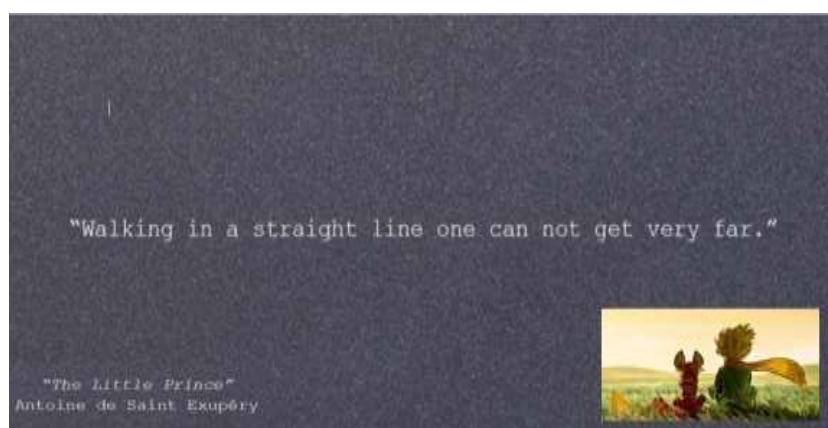
'Do you struggle to teach class 3 sometimes?' was one of the questions that Madison and Eloise asked Ms Blake.

The interviewers discovered that 'wild camping, hiking, swimming and spending time with family' are some of Ms Blake's favourite hobbies when she's not teaching.

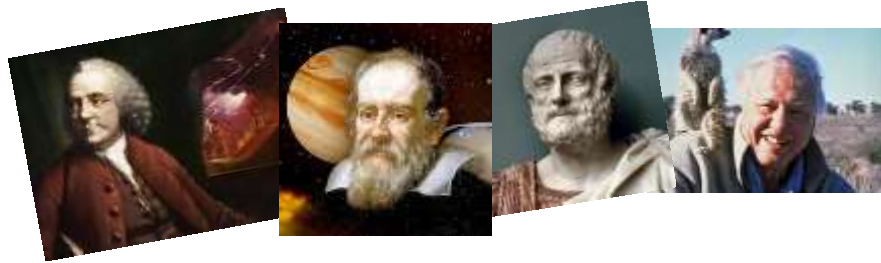

Thank you to Ms Blake for letting Eloise and Madison interview you, and thank you to you all for reading the School Newspaper.



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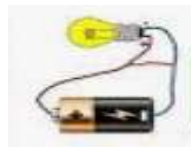


Science

Scientists we look at in Wawne

In this edition of the Wawne School newspaper I'm going to tell you about some famous scientists in our science subjects.

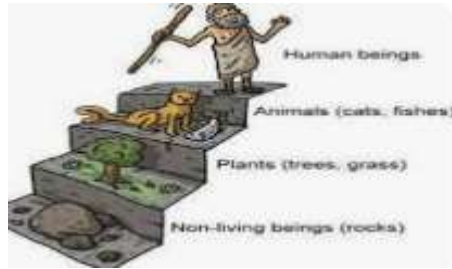


In Class 3, we are doing electricity in Science, and I want to talk to you about famous scientists in electricity. The scientist I want to talk to you about, is someone called Benjamin Franklin.

Benjamin is the person who proved that lightning is the same force as electricity. He proved this point by putting a key onto a piece of string that was hooked up to a kite. Benjamin flew this kite during an electrical storm (a thunder storm) to check his theory. When a thunder bolt finally struck his kite the current of electricity was channelled down the kite's string through the key. When he went to touch the key, he felt the charge of the power of the lightning inside the key but he did not die from touching it.



In Class 2 they are doing sound. The Class 2 scientist I want to speak to you about was called Galileo Galilei. He is famous for 2 reasons 1 of which is irrelevant to this subject. The one I want to talk to you about is that Galileo discovered *pitch*. He discovered this pitch by scraping a metal chisel along a metal blade at different speeds. He measured this in *frequency*.



In Class 1, they are doing animals and their habitats (their homes). For this subject, I want to talk to you about a man who was called Aristotle. He was a Greek philosopher as well as being a scientist. Aristotle was the man who separated all living things. For example, there are: mammals, trees, birds and many more, some of which are well hidden in forests and jungles. Some of them we may never be able to find because they are well adapted and hidden.



Finally, in the **Foundation Stage** of Wawne, they are doing 3 subjects which are: Natural World, Animal Life Cycle and Food. The scientist who covers this is called David Attenborough. He is a biologist, scientist and author. He is on the TV and in books. David Attenborough is famous for being in a TV series and in a lot of books.

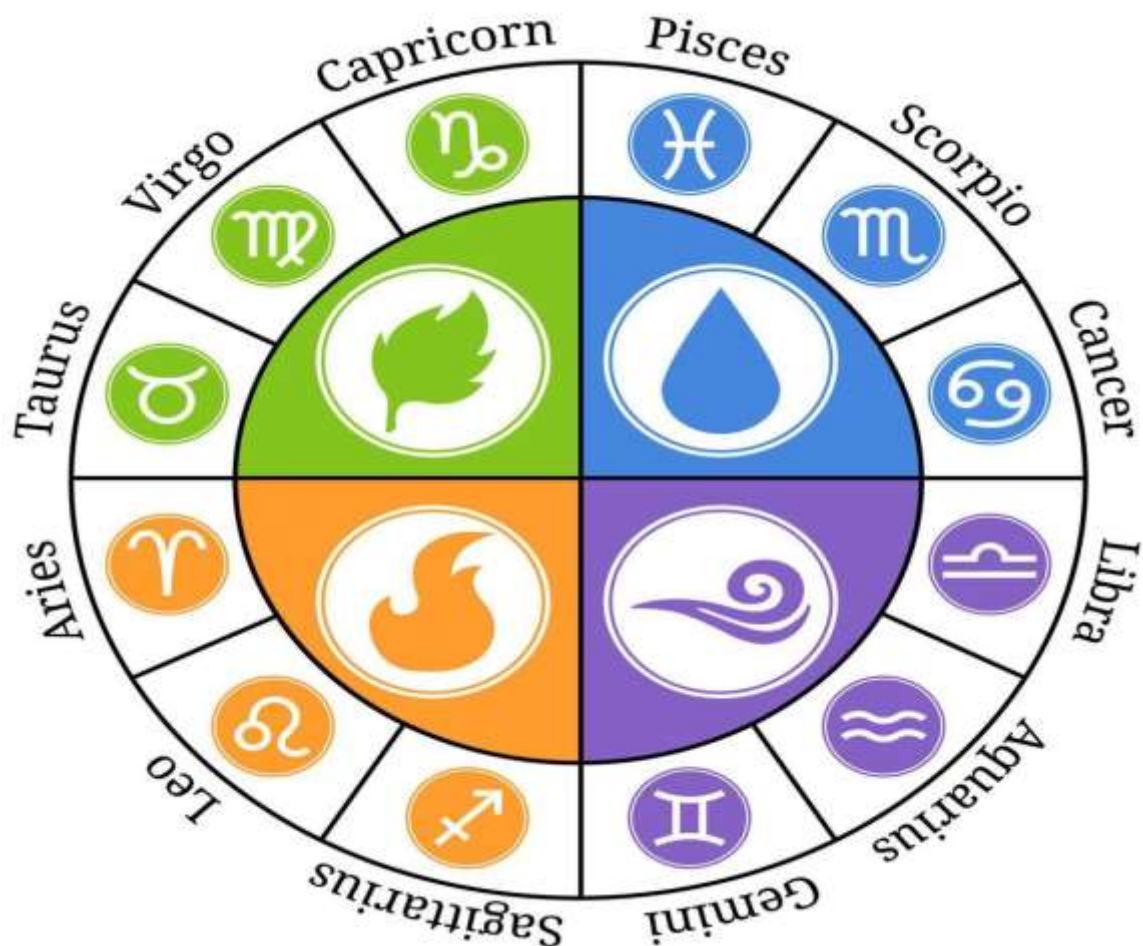

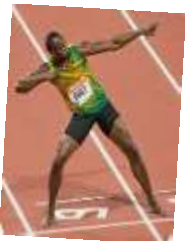


FAMOUS SPORT CHAMPIONS!
