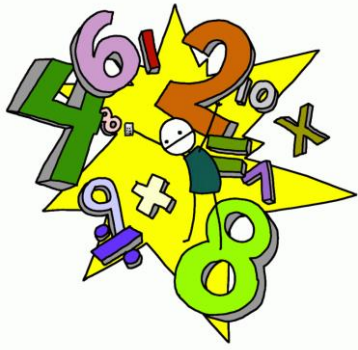

And Hannah thought it wasn't too hard and it was in the middle.

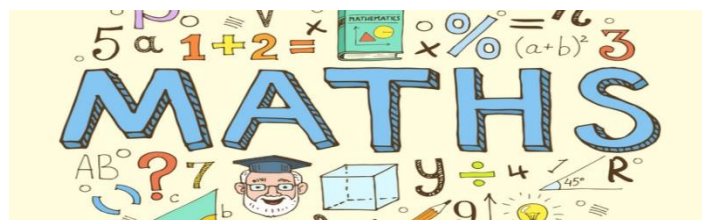
Eloise thought some questions were easy but some took lots of workings out.
